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Reading At Home

Evidence shows that children who read regularly at home become better readers than others, so please do hear you child read at home at least 3 times a week, so that you can give them this advantage in their learning.

Our Learning;

English



In English, we will be learning about lists, labels, captions and information writing.

In addition to this all children in KS1 get a daily phonics lesson to help them with their reading and writing of sounds.

Maths + - × ÷

In maths, Year one children will be counting to ten, (forwards and backwards), reading and writing numbers to ten in numerals and words, using a number line and identifying one more and one less. Place value will be a large part of Year twos learning this half term, along with reading and writing numbers to 100, estimating and comparing numbers.

Topic

This term our topic is 'Ourselves'. The children will be learning about body parts, the senses, different stages in their lives and about keeping fit and healthy. Additionally, we will be looking at maps of the UK.

ClassDojo

We are continuing to use Class Dojo in school so do sign up so that you can see when your child receives Dojo points. Over the year many photos and messages will be sent to you on Dojo, so it really helps us keep in touch!
